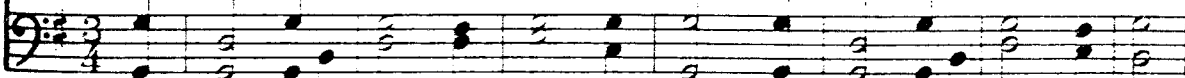


# Amazing Grace! How Sweet the Sound 507
